Another new piece which will open its edition at the Calgary Stampede this year is called **“Morning Ritual”**. It features a cowgirl just bridling her horse for the day ahead. As always the new pieces shown as original clay, will be offered at Stampede at the pre-cast price.

Last year at the Stampede, I introduced a piece called **“A Leap of Faith”**. Then still in clay, it depicted a cowgirl pushing a herd of mares with foals across a river. This year it's done! I am so pleased to show you the finished product cast in bronze! It has turned out to be an exquisite piece! Attention cattle folks...alongside this one is a new piece sure to be a favorite!

I thank the Calgary Flames for the opportunity to create the Bud McCaig memorial award which we called **“Respect”**.
